What is AMEREF?

AMEREF is the Alaska Mineral & Energy Resource Education Fund, a partnership between the Alaska Department of Education and private industry to provide educational material, in the form of Alaska Resources Kits, to Alaskan teachers. The kits contain a standards-based, Alaska-specific interdisciplinary set of lessons, activities, and support materials which provide students with balanced information about Alaska's rich heritage with mineral, energy, and forest resources.



Kit materials include samples of oil, minerals, and rocks indigenous to Alaska, videos, an interactive CD, posters, maps, reference books, Sitka spruce cross-sections, and dozens of lesson plans and learning activities. The kits have been accepted in all of Alaska's 54 school districts

and demand continues to grow. Alaska teachers and industry scientists continually revise and update the kits to keep them current. The kits are so flexible they are used in classrooms from kindergarten through high school for science, math, social studies, Alaska studies and other subjects.

AMEREF's Mission is to provide Alaskan Students with the knowledge and skills to make informed and objective decisions relating to mineral, energy, and forest resources.
