


- Shut down existing mines and prohibit future mines

- Rob Alaskan communities and Native Alaskans of revenues, opportunities and the ability to be self-reliant






Pogo Mine located on state land






Red Dog Mine located on NANA land








The Red Dog Operating Agreement

- Protection of land and subsistence resources




Red Dog Mine Timeline





Teck Cominco's Cash Flow (Cumulative)




Payments to NANA Region (Cumulative)



ISO Certification

The Red Dog Environmental Management System (EMS) is ISO 14001 certified. This certification is an international environmental standard that defines the overall structure and requirements of an EMS. The standard is based on compliance with regulations, prevention of pollution and continual improvement.







Mining Shutdown Initiatives

- Prohibits any "large scale metallic mining operation" that exceeds 640 acres
- Prohibits the release of water containing any trace amount of metals or chemicals
- Prohibits tailings ponds and waste rock storage



Impacts to Alaska

- Elimination of thousands of existing and future jobs in more than 100 communities across
 Alaska
- A loss of over \$175 million per year in state government revenue
- \$10 BILLION or more in state revenues over long term
