

#### President's National Energy Policy



The BLM has a significant role in meeting the President's National Energy Policy.

The goal: To provide for the environmentally-sound development of oil and natural gas on Federal lands.

#### **Land-Use Planning**

- Public lands are made available for leasing only after they have been evaluated through BLM's multiple-use planning process.
- The BLM is currently undertaking a major effort to update the land use plans which are the basis for all of its actions.


#### **BLM Initiatives (cont.)**



#### Permitting / Timeliness

- The Bureau is working on various actions to expedite internal administrative processes, such as the processing of Applications for Permits to Drill (APDs).
- The BLM continues to cooperate and consult with the oil and gas industry regarding efforts to more efficiently process drilling permits.
- The Bureau is working with the oil and gas industry to improve business processes through the use of electronic commerce. This allows industry to file electronic applications and forms.
- BLM is part of a multi-agency effort to inventory oil and gas reserves and resources on onshore public lands, and to identify the impediments and restrictions to accessing, leasing and developing those resources.

Transportation & Infrastructure


- BLM has prioritized the processing of energy related rights-of-way.
- BLM is near completion of its right-of-way renewal for TAPS.
- There are currently two federal rights-of-way in place for an Alaska natural gas pipeline project:
  - → The Alaska Natural Gas Transportation System (ANGTS)
  - → The Trans-Alaska Gas System (TAGS)

#### **Competitive Lease Sales**

BLM completed an Integrated Activity Plan/Environmental Impact Statement for the NE portion of NPR-A in 1998.


Results to date: Oil and gas lease sales in 1999 and 2002.





#### NPR-A Lease Sale 991 May 1999





- BLM offered 3.9 million acres for lease in Eastern NPR-A
- Industry paid over \$104 million for 133 tracts (870,000 acres)
- First sale in the reserve since 1984
- Leases are for a period of 10 years




- Royalty rates:
  - 16.67 % for the high potential area
  - 12.5 % for the low potential area
- Rental rates:
  - \$5/acre/year for high-potential lands \$3/acre/year for low-potential lands



#### NPR-A Lease Sale June 2002





- BLM offered 3 million acres for lease in 2nd Eastern NPR-A sale
- Industry paid over \$63.8 million for 60 tracts (579,269 acres)
- Second sale in the reserve since 1984
- BP did not bid on any tracts in this sale
- Two companies that have not been active in the reserve to date also submitted bids:

TotalFinaElf E&P USA

\* winning bids totaling \$53,532,000

EnCana Oil and Gas (USA) Inc.


\* winning bids totaling \$920,000
