

- Well developed prospect inventory




Cook Inlet Lease Holdings





Portfolio Highlights - Osprey



- First platform installed in Cook Inlet in 16 years
- Innovative design received award from American Council of Engineering Companies
- 3 pipelines lead to shore oil, gas and water
- Kustatan onshore processing facility constructed near established infrastructure
- Platform and facility capacity: 20,000 BOPD
- 28 slot platform (7 slots in each leg)

Environmental Innovations & Design Concepts

- First electrified platform (no fired vessels)
- First electric drilling rig conversion in Cook Inlet
- First platform designed to re-inject produced water
- First development program to inject all drilling cuttings
- First pipeline system to utilize boreholes to cross shoreline

Alaska's Investment Climate

(Example)

- Over 4 years to acquire permits
- Lawsuit by Cook Inlet Keeper against the State for exploration phase
- Supreme Court ruling against DGC for utilizing federal studies in their review process
- Supreme Court injunction against Forest Oil to shut down drilling which required 100+ layoffs
- Supreme Court remand of permitting flaws back to DGC
- SB 343 clarifies legislative intent and past practices, prevents 1 year delay
- SB 371 clarifies legislative intent and past practices, prevents 1 year delay
- Lawsuit by Cook Inlet Keeper against the State on field development permits
- Lawsuit by Cook Inlet Keeper to stay the development activities pending review of underlying case

Alaska's Investment Climate

- Can Be Improved By:
 - Eliminating the public interest litigant reimbursement program
 - Special interest litigants to provide bonds to cover the damages caused by frivolous lawsuits
 - Passing legislation clarifying the role of the regulators to where they can make good decisions without fear of nuisance lawsuits
 - Selective rulings by permitting agencies to be exempt from judicial review
 - Fix the CZM process or eliminate it
