




The Nation's Unemployment Rate Still In Remarkable Place


Annual employment growth rate







Fish harvesting and processing employment in the great state of AK




Fish Harvesting Employment--Now That Is Seasonality!




Despite The Steady Loss Of Oil Production, Employment Grew In Alaska



Where Oil Industry Workers Live



















Alaska's Population Gains Grew With National Recession--But Returning to "Normality"

(Number of PFD applicants fell by over 7,000 in 2013, biggest drop since 1989--another one of those resting on laurels things)


Total annual population gains for Alaska




Population Growth in Alaska--Grew By 22,067 Between 2010-2012




Employment Grows with Gold Prices


How a Severe Recession May Have Looked Alaska jobs, 2005 to 2011





Earnings Gains and Losses After Being Adjusted For Cost-of-Living






Percent of Alaskans who were in Alaska at age 18 and again at Age 22, 1995-2010, based on PFD data






In The Year Twenty-Twenty-five, Here Is How Many Of Us There Might Be--By Age


